

Demand is higher and/or capacity is limited




GREEN

North America	LATAM		We are see backlogs into LATAM in particular to SCL and MEX, even express service is not gaining us space.
North America	Europe		With summer season ending we will see some capacity issues into Europe.
North America	Middle East		We are continuing to see flight cancelation and reduced capacity into the Middle East,
North America	Asia Pacific		We are seeing some carriers continue to reduce flights from China into the US. That is due to the slowdown in e-commerce.
North America	India		Capacity can still be an issue, especially for the larger shipments and we are seeing a small increase in rates. More request for express to arrive prior to the tarrif deadline.
North America	Africa & Turkey		Capacity is returning to normal levels with the return of passenger demand and added PAX flights.

Europe	North America		Several transatlantic flights are cancelled during winter schedule, starting in October. Holiday season is known for high demand. Capacity will be constrained as of November. Freighter connection capacity is volatile and subject to demand fluctuations caused by tariff war disruptions.
Europe	Europe		Many short haul routes are serviced with narrowbody equipment, Alternatively, Road Feeder Service can cover the demand.
Europe	Middle East		Rates are stable, capacity remains available both on passenger aircrafts as well as on regular freighter service. Middle East carriers are ambitiously growing capacity over the next years.
Europe	Asia Pacific		Outbound capacity remains available; Many Asian carriers still see an imbalanced demand for backhaul flights. Rates hold a low level, Due congestion in West European region, there is additional capacity deployed ex airports in Eastern Europe airports.
Europe	LATAM		Passenger rates have stabilized while we still have limited trans-Atlantic maindeck capacity available in the market. Significant gaps with rates on passenger aircrafts. Deferred flights are available at lower costs.
Europe	Africa & Turkey		Rates are at a stable level, capacity is available out of Europe, demand is expected to remain stable for next months.
Europe	India		New maindeck capacity has been added to the market, as backhaul demand continues increasing. For now, ample capacity is available.

Asia	Intra-Asia & India		Adequate capacity but minimal WB capacity available. Asian carriers displacing lower yielding Intra Asia volumes for higher yielding Trans-Pacific loads via their hubs putting pressure on rates
Asia	Africa & Turkey		Airlines like ET/TK increasing capacity to Africa/Turkey, but demand and rates outstrip capacity for the time being
Asia	LATAM		Minimal capacity available ex APAC and first leg access to EU/US a major challenge. Rates to LATAM are rocketing and continues to be a lucrative segment ex APAC.

Middle East	LATAM		The combination of decreased capacity from the Middle East and increased demand in Latin America suggests potential upward pressure on rates.

Middle East	Europe		Spot rates from the UAE to Europe are falling as carriers offer more available space.
